Youth Parole Authority Board Members

The twelve Board Members of the YPA are appointed for a four-year term by the Governor and approved by the State Senate. The Youth Parole Authority is an autonomous organization. Board Members have training or experience in social work, law, juvenile or criminal justices, or related behavioral sciences. Board Members have the responsibility of parole release, recission, revocation, and termination of parole for youth committed to the Division for secure confinement. The YPA is also responsible for length of stay decisions.
